





The Importance of American
Sovereignty

No other nation on earth has our
founding documents:

The Declaration of Independence
and
The Constitution

- our “System Restore” point
- the foundation of our freedom

The Rule of law

- Life, liberty, and property.
- A republic, not a democracy.
- The rule of law rather than the will of the majority (or the tyranny of the minority).

The Rule of Law

- A nation that permits its chief executive to issue Executive Orders has more in common with a dictatorship or a monarchy than it does a republic.

The Importance of American Sovereignty

- America was never intended to be governed by human rights.
- We are rapidly losing the conflict between natural rights and human rights.
- Most Americans have no idea we are in a war for our survival as a free nation.
- America is not Europe. America is unique because of our Constitution.

Politics

- Any debate in the halls of power focuses inevitably on fulfilling human rights obligations (buying votes) rather than upholding natural rights.
- The truth and the facts are often irrelevant to the debate – if they can be found at all.

How do you destroy American sovereignty?

- Make Americans feel guilty about consuming so much of the world's resources, while simultaneously promoting and encouraging consumption.

(The U.S. Military is the largest single consumer of energy in the world.)

How do you destroy American sovereignty?

- Entangle America in agreements and treaties that subject us to the authority of international tribunals and to other countries.

How did the United Nations take over our government?

- Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), 1948
- Declaration on the Rights of the Child, 1959
- Law of the Sea Treaty (LOST), 1982
- United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, 2007 (signed by Barack Hussein Obama in 2010)
- Agenda 21 / Sustainable Development

Natural Rights vs. Human Rights

- *Natural* rights are the "I may work to improve my situation as I see fit" rights.
- If I don't work, I don't eat.
- I have the *right* to pursue happiness, not the *guarantee* of happiness.
- I have the right to buy, own, and control property free from the threat of arbitrary or illegal search and seizure.

Natural Rights vs. Human Rights

- *Human* rights are the "the world owes me a living" rights.
 - I have the right to share in the fruit of your labors because I live on this planet, and because you have more than I do, which is unfair.
 - All the earth is the common property of its inhabitants.
 - All must share, and the government is armed and empowered to force us to share.

How are natural rights taken away?

- Schools: replace the duties of responsible citizenship with "situation ethics" and moral relativism. Promote immorality and reduce academic standards.

How are natural rights taken away?

- Society: Create confusion about the role of government by creating immense schemes of wealth redistribution. Teach people that government is their master and will take care of them.

How are natural rights taken away?

- Government: Pass extremely complex laws that create massive bureaucracies. Have every branch of government declare how important they are and demand that we submit to their will.

Natural rights are inalienable and given of God. They make men free to pursue life, liberty, and happiness.

Human rights are created by men to steal human and natural resources and destroy natural rights.

Human rights must be paid for. Natural rights need only be maintained by honest, courageous, and moral people.

- When free people fail to understand the laws that govern them, they are more easily victimized and enslaved by their government.

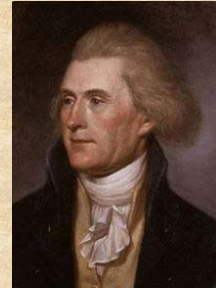
Why the Constitution has no constituency

- We have replaced natural rights with human rights.

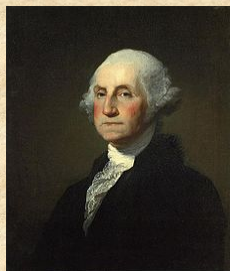
Education is the essential component

"A primary object should be the education of our youth in the science of government. In a republic, what species of knowledge can be equally important? And what duty more pressing ... than ... communicating it to those who are to be the future guardians of the liberties of the country."

How will we overcome and reverse the damage that has already been done?

- Demonstrate the inevitable consequences of what has been done to us.
- Educate Americans about the Constitution and natural rights.
- Kindle the spark of freedom in the hearts of millions of Americans.
- Create opportunities for Americans to choose freedom over slavery.

A national organization

- A national organization (or more than one) is needed that will be able to do these things.

What will this organization look like?

This organization must:

- ✓ Have members
 - ✓ Collect dues
 - ✓ Recruit local, state, regional and national organization leaders.
 - ✓ Recruit, train, and run candidates for public office at all levels.
 - ✓ Engage in political activism.
 - ✓ Promote morality, decency, and integrity.
 - ✓ Educate the people in true principles.
- Only a political party can do all these things.

The Constitution Party

- Only a completely Constitutional approach can rescue America from becoming a socialist welfare state.
- Any other approach risks the complete loss of the Constitution.

We are the solution.

Organize, Organize, Organize

- “The same ten people”
- Ask people to make a commitment
- Everyone brings someone new to each meeting.
- Members are asked to make a commitment to pay dues and to devote time, talents, and resources.

A Volunteer Organization

Member Recruitment

Key Points:

- Members recruit new members from among their friends, family, neighbors, fellow church members, and business associates.
- Members are trained in recruiting techniques at each chapter meeting.
- Most of the time members invite, but the actual recruiting is performed at the committee meeting by volunteer “recruiters”.
- New members complete a Talents and Abilities Survey to help determine how they might most effectively serve in the organization.
- Those with specific talents or interests will be groomed and trained either for leadership within the party or to run for and serve in elective office.

Party Leader recruitment and training

Key Points:

- In order for the Party to grow we need thousands of active local committees whose leaders will devote several hours per week to the Party.
- Party leader candidates will be interviewed and recruited by current local Party leaders.
- Each local committee will have seventeen officers, of which eleven will comprise the local Executive Council.
- The eleven local committee officers who comprise the Executive Council are:

Treasurer	Committee Secretary
Committee Historian	Activities Coordinator
Education Coordinator	Committee Website Editor
Ballot Access Specialist	Trainer
Teacher, Continuing Education Class

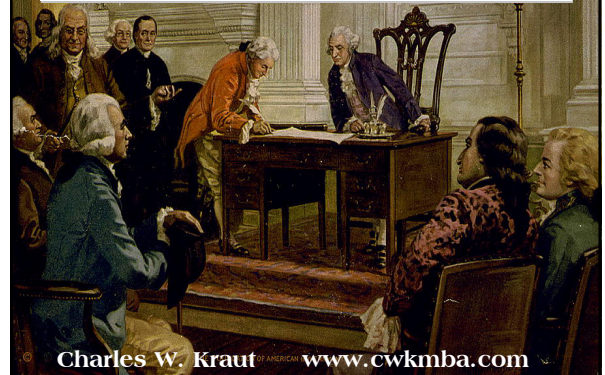
